



Dr. David Cashin is professor of intercultural studies at Columbia Biblical Seminary and School of Ministry. He obtained his bachelor of arts degree in history from Gordon College and his master of arts and doctor of philosophy in indology from Stockholm University, Sweden. While in Sweden, Dr. Cashin served as pastor of two churches. He wrote and taught courses and seminars in Islamic history, theology and Muslim-Christian relations.

Carl Pilkinton was born in Taranaki and grew up in Porirua, north of Wellington. He was a volunteer and eventually staff for 5 years in Te Ora Hou in Porirua, a Youth For Christ ministry aimed at at risk youth. Following 2 years of teaching in Porirua he completed a BMin in mission (Laidlaw College). From 2002 -2009, along with his wife and family, he was engaged in a church planting team in West Africa. Since 2012, Carl and his wife Sharlene have led a church in Gisborne called Wainui Beach Church. They have three children aged 14, 11 and 8.

Romans

20 - 24 May

5 credits • NZQF Level 6

Russell Thorp, MTh (Merit), BMin, DipTch, DipTLA

A study of Paul's letter to the Romans including a structural and contextual overview, an exegetical treatment of selected passages, and a study of major theological themes and emphases. This one week block course is taught with a special emphasis on God's plan of salvation for the nations.

Children in Crisis

24 - 28 June

5 credits • NZQF Level 6

Becky Bee, MEd(TESOL), BEd, GradDipMin, DipTchg, ThA, Cert IV

An examination of the multi-faceted problems that street children encounter on a daily basis – at risk from abuse, trauma, hunger, and pain. The course will help the student gain an understanding of the situations these children confront on a daily basis and identify the losses they experience on the streets. Prevention and intervention strategies are presented to address the children's needs, and guidance is given to prevent street workers from experiencing stress and burnout.

Christian-Muslim Dialogues

22 - 26 July

5 credits • NZQF Level 5

David Cashin, PhD

A fascinating insight into the dialogues between the evangelical church and the wider Muslim world, both historically and currently. The class will look at the need for this dialogue, and how to engage in it. It will also look at the role of Christian-Muslim dialogue in Christian ministry among Muslims and the principles for this dialogue. Dr Cashin has had many years of experience of Christian-Muslim dialogue in Asia, USA and Western Europe.

Spiritual Warfare

29 July - 2 August

5 credits • NZQF Level 5

David Cashin, PhD

A one week introductory examination of spiritual warfare. This is a study of the nature of the encounter between God and satanic powers in human experience, set against the background of biblical revelation about the spirit world. The class studies Satan's strategy to counter world evangelization and to cause Christians to be ineffective in ministry and teaches effective prayer strategies to bring God's power into practical situations faced by those involved in Christian ministry.

Church Planting Across Cultures

16 - 27 September

10 credits • NZQF Level 6

Carl Pilkinton, B.A., Dip Tchg, BMin

This two week course overviews the process of starting churches and their consequent maturation and growth. Particular focus is placed on the challenges of planting indigenous churches in a cross cultural context. The course provides a biblical basis for church planting and develops a biblical Ecclesiology. The course will address significant theoretical issues before introducing models and strategies needed for indigenous church planting.

Coaching Workshop

10 - 12 December

Christine Harding, BMin, MTh

The COACH Model© is a radically different approach to leading people. Rather than provide answers, leaders ask questions to draw out what God has already put into others. Learn how to create powerful conversations to assist others to solve their own problems, reach goals and develop leadership skills in the process.
