TESOL for SERVICE

Monday 5th - Friday 30th, January 2026

This course is designed to equip you to use English teaching effectively and with integrity through learning:

Communicative Competence - skill in using the language

Linguistic Knowledge - knowing about the language

Theoretical Knowledge - knowledge about language learning

Methodological Competence - skill in designing and teaching class activities

This is an NZQA accredited and approved training course. On successful completion of the course, you will gain the *Essentials of TESOL Certificate (Level 5)*, a recognized qualification for teaching overseas.

Requirements

- Teaching experience is helpful but not necessary
- Commitment to service
- Minimum qualifications * - successful completion of a course at level 5 or above OR NCEA English level 3
- Applicants who are non-native speakers of English require a 7.0 IELTS score or equivalent

* If you do not meet the minimum qualifications level you will need to pass a pre-course task in order to enrol in the course. This is comprised of writing a 800-word essay and demonstrating an awareness of mistakes in writing.

You will be notified by Friday, **October 3rd**, regarding your acceptance into the course. If accepted, you will receive the enrolment form and bank details via email. **A non-refundable payment of 50% of your costs will be required within 1 month of notification of acceptance.**

Course Content & Assessment

a) Pre-course Work

Read 2 set textbooks and complete 2 assignments based on one of the textbooks (20% of final grade).

Observe 2 ESOL classes taught by qualified and experienced ESOL teachers and complete supplied observation sheets.

b) Course Work

Week 1:

Classes 5 hours per day, reading homework in the evenings.

Weeks 2-4:

Classes 3 hours per day in the morning, lesson preparation in the afternoons.

Teach ESOL students 2 evenings per week.

Assessment:

Oral presentation of a book review in week 4 (10% of final grade).

c) Practicum

80 mins in-class teaching of fellow students.

4.5 hours supervised teaching in pairs, with ESOL students .

Each lesson is observed by an experienced ESOL teacher with feedback given after each session (70% of final grade).

Assessment:

An assessment sheet is given after each lesson.

By the final lesson, students are expected to have reached either standard or above standard in at least 75% of the criteria on the assessment sheet.

If a student receives a below standard assessment on more than 25% of the criteria in the final lesson, the student will not pass the course.
